Copper -- Cokeville

"About 1000 tons of copper ore have been removed from the old Hoskins mine in Lincoln county, 32 miles north of here. Work is being done thru the old shaft at the mine but ore is being stockpiled awaiting the completion of the access road from the mine, which is on Hobble Creek, to the Smithsfork highway. The county has constructed six miles of the road and the remainder will be done by the grazing service. Mine machinery will be brought in as soon as the road is completed. Lauckey Young of Cokeville, co-lessee of the mine, is in charge of the operations."
