

- 12 miles southeast of Rock Springs
- Site of unusual rocks, including alunite, travertine, free sulfur, silicified breccia, kaolinite & jasperoid
- Mountain is capped by sandstone & quartzite of the Rock Springs Formation
- Provides a sweeping view to the north across the Rock Springs uplift, a prominent Laramide structure cut by U.S. Juterstate 80 in southwestern Wyoming
