

- Off Wyoming State Highway 130 west of Centennial in the Snowy Range
- Highest point in the Medicine Bow Mountains at 12,013 feet
- The Paleoproterozoic quartzite dips steeply southeastward at approximately 70 degrees & is 4,350-6,000 feet thick
