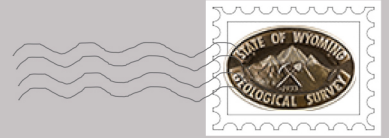

- *Highest point in the Medicine Bow Mountains at 12,013 feet*
- *The Paleoproterozoic quartzite dips steeply southeastward at approximately 70 degrees & is 4,350-6,000 feet thick*
