Oregon Buttes



- Near South Pass City, rising out of the northwestern portion of the Red Desert
- Flat-topped mesas that served as a landmark for settlers traveling the Oregon Trail
- Exposed rocks are Tertiary sedimentary rocks consisting of lacustrine & fluviatile deposits
- Highest elevation is 8,612 feet on the north butte
