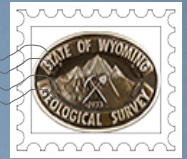


Next stop on the ABCs tour of Wyoming's geologic wonders ...

Split Rock

- *North of U.S. Highway 287 between Jeffrey City & Muddy Gap Junction*
- *A prominent knob used as a landmark for pioneers using the Oregon Trail*
- *Cleft in the summit caused by weathering away of mafic dike rock that intruded along fractures in the granite*
