Percis Claims - Copper - Sec. 1, T. 18, R. 73 - 6 claims, 2 on Sec. 12,
4 on Sec. 1, - (near mouth of Wallrock Canyon -
owned by Tom Rees and Stanley Tohoski)

The ore occurs in the Casper (?) formation which here is principally limestone with occasional brown chert bands. The copper minerals are malachite, chalcocite, and cuprite.

The copper minerals have replaced the chert in the limestone. The occurrence is very erratic and only part of the thin chert beds have been replaced by copper.

Apparently some production was made from this property and one about 5 miles north. The ore was hand picked and shipped. The property north of here is largely veinlets and replacement in Casper limestone - not much chert.
