

Reisenweaver, E. E. - Sec. 1, T. 53, R. 85, 26 mi. SW of Sheridan.

Three pits and a shaft. The pits are about 10' deep (2 are) by 8' by 4', the third is 5' deep by 6'x10'. The shaft is 28' deep. Small pit 4'x6' by 3' deep.

A quartz-feldspar-biotite granite in every hole and some have a little hb-schist. This is supposedly a ferberite-scheelite deposit with some copper and gold. Assayed 18.5 gold at 16' - probably a picked sample.

No tungsten seen anywhere, or copper. The granite has been cut by pegmatitic material carrying a little black tourmaline and a little vermiculite.

15-28-42 Three pits and a shaft. The pits are about 10' deep (2 are) by 8' by 4', the third is 5' deep by 6' x 10'. The shaft is 28' deep. Small pit 4' x 6' by 3' deep.

A quartz-feldspar-biotite granite in every hole and some have a little *lib-schist*. This is supposedly a *ferberite-scheelite* deposit with some copper and gold. Assayed 18.5 gold at 16' - probably a picked sample.

No tungsten seen anywhere, or copper. The granite has been cut by pegmatitic material carrying a little black tourmaline and a little peruvianite.
