NOTES ON THE RUSSELL CREEK URANIUM PROSPECT, PARK COUNTY

Location and Ownership

The deposit consists of 8 claims located on the north side of Russell Creek in NE 1/4 sec. 31, T. 56 N., R. 104 W. The locators are Don Snyder, John Jones, and Art Braten, all of Cody.

The prospect was examined on August 12, 1955, in the company of Carl Dunrud.

Geology

Anomalous radioactivity occurs in the Flathead formation about 150 feet above the Cambrian - pre-Cambrian contact. The scintillator recorded a maximum of 0.24 MR/hr. in a small prospect pit that was excavated in a yellowish brown fine-grained sandstone. The radioactivity appears to be confined to a six-inch ferruginous stained sandstone that lies between two manganiferous stained sandstone beds. The background count in the area averages 0.12 MR/hr.

A drill hole located at the west end of the deposit, and reportedly 90 feet deep, penetrated a light gray loosely consolidated coarse-grained sandstone. Drill cuttings examined by the writer were not radioactive.

No uranium minerals were identified by the writer, and no relationship of radioactivity to structure was observed.
